DRESS POLICY

The Corona-Norco Unified School District evaluated the following dress code policies and these standards are in affect and mandated by the district and Centennial High School.

Education Code 35183 authorizes school districts to adopt dress codes. The Corona-Norco Unified School District's Board of Education is legally and ethically responsible for the establishment of classroom and campus environments that are conductive to an orderly and productive educational program. The dress and grooming of this policy are required to meet this responsibility and establish minimum standards in the schools of the Corona-Norco Unified School District.

The following minimum standards shall be enforced:

- A. Any clothing, makeup, hairstyle, or wig that contributes to the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the school is unacceptable or innapropriate for the school attire. Dress should be suitable and comfortable for normal school activities. Clothing should correspond with the demands and purpose of the activity in which the student participates. Clothing should be clean and in good repair.
- B. Skirts and shorts shall be worn at an appropriate/acceptable length for sitting as well as standing so that undergarments shall not show. Skirts and dresses may be of any style if all slits, openings and length are no higher than half the distance between the knee and waist and do not expose one's underclothing. No undergarments or posteriors shall show. Shirts and shorts cannot be tight as to show the outline of undergarments.
- C. Pants must fit at the hip so they will stay on without a belt.
- D. Footwear with soles must be worn at all times.
- E. Apparel with emblems, printing, etc., that is obscene, libelous, or slanderous, or that incites students to create a clear and present danger are not permitted on campus and may not be worm. Skin art, which meet the beforementioned criteria, must be covered.
- F. The following are considered unacceptable for attire: gang affiliated doo rags, wave caps, hairnets, or bandanas; strapless halter tops or tube tops; bare midriffs; undergarments showing; chains or weapons; no shirts; lack of undergarments; emblems, lettering or pictures pertaining to drugs, alcohol, sex or profanity, gangs, taggers, or party crews; shirts, tops or sweaters unbuttoned below the sternum; bathing suits, or pajamas, unless on an authorized spirit day; unsafe jewelry or clothing.

HAT POLICY

Students may not wear, or be in possession of, any non-Centennial approved hats or visors of any kind before, during, or after school. The following are approved Centennial hats:

- Hats with a Centennial "C" logo which only contain the school colors of red, black, white, or gray
- Beanies, berets, cadet or bucket hats which contain no logo and which only contain the school colors.
- Hats sold in the Student Store.
